PRESIDENT'S REPORT BISHIOP FELIPE A. SALAZAR

PRESIDENT'S BIENNIAL REPORT BISHOP FELIPE A. SALAZAR APOSTOLIC ASSEMBLY OF THE FAITH IN CHRIST JESUS NOVEMBER 27, 2024 (2022-2024)

Esteemed Bishops, International Delegates, Missionaries, Elders, Pastors, and Ministers of the Apostolic Assembly,

Praise the Lord.

First, I want to express my gratitude to Christ, the Lord of my life and the Church, for choosing me to serve Him and his Church as the General Pastor of the Apostolic Assembly. I also want to express my appreciation to the Pastors of our Church for granting me the opportunity to represent the Church as their President. It is a great honor.

Today, with great pleasure, I welcome you to the General Convention of the Apostolic Assembly of the Faith in Christ Jesus. I am confident that this convention will be a blessing to everyone in attendance and serve as a catalyst for God's plans for our great Church in the upcoming years. In this report, I will inform the Bishops and Pastors of my activities from November 2022 to September 2024.

PSALMS 121:1 I WILL LIFT UP MINE EYES UNTO THE HILLS, FROM WHENCE COMETH MY HELP. 2 MY HELP COMETH FROM THE LORD, WHICH MADE HEAVEN AND EARTH. 3 HE WILL NOT SUFFER THY FOOT TO BE MOVED: HE THAT KEEPETH THEE WILL NOT SLUMBER. 4 BEHOLD, HE THAT KEEPETH ISRAEL SHALL NEITHER SLUMBER NOR SLEEP.

I. INTRODUCTION

I have included Psalms 121:1-4 because it expresses my feelings well after two years of serving as the President of the Apostolic Assembly. The Lord has helped me every step of the way. He has carefully watched over me, guided me, and kept my feet from stumbling.

The meaning of the phrase "I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills" is not totally clear to theologians. While some scholars think that the hills refer to the mountains that surrounded Jerusalem or even to heaven, others surmise that the hills refer to the "high places" where the pagan gods were believed to live. However, that may be the psalmist intended to emphasize that his help came from the Lord, not from any other sources. The one who had made the heavens, and the Earth was his helper.

David understood that the most significant part of his life's story was that the Lord had been his helper. David could never have risen to the place of honor God granted him without God's help. In other words, as David was faithful to God, God worked his will in his life, taking him to places he would have never gone. That truth is evident throughout David's life. Consider the following examples. As David faithfully watched over his father's flock, it was the Lord who helped him kill the lion and the bear. In obedience to his father's command, David went to the battlefield to take his brother's food, but it was the Lord who took him before Goliath and then struck him down. David loyally served King Saul, but the Lord alone was responsible for bringing him to Israel's throne. As David was faithful in the little, God took him to the places where he would be most useful to Him. The life of King David was only possible because of God's hand upon him. If we think about it, David's story is all our stories; it is certainly mine.

Based on this understanding, I dedicate this report to the Glory of God.

It is because the Lord has helped us that today, I can present this presidential report to our Church's pastoral and episcopal bodies. In a minimal format, this report describes our administration's work in the last two years.

II. THE VISION OF THE CHURCH

Directing the Church's vision is implicit in the constitution as a presidential responsibility. I have labored to clarify the vision of our Church. The vision is crucial because it guides our decisions and, ultimately, the Church's direction. The vision the Lord gave me for the Church is that **the Apostolic Assembly is a healthy, growing, Spirit-filled Apostolic cellular church**. That vision has become the guiding statement that has led my efforts as President of our great Church. I focused on the Strategy of Jesus because I saw it as biblical and offering the most significant promise for the future growth of our Church.

I believe that focus is a matter of deciding what you will do and then fully committing to the course of action necessary to get it done for our organization; that was the Strategy of Jesus. Motivating the Church to focus on its mission and vision was the direction it took. The following is a summary of the work done to focus the Church on its mission.

1) CAST THE VISION TO THE GENERAL BOARD AND BISHOPS.

As we began our administration, the first item on my agenda was to set the vision for the next four years. At the December 2022 meeting of the General Board, I cast the vision to the members of the General Board. I told the board at that meeting, "I envision the Strategy of Jesus playing a crucial role in the Church's future growth. For the vision of church growth to become effective in the Apostolic Assembly, every official of the Apostolic Assembly must speak the same thing. That means that the General Board and the Bishops must become the primary promoters of the vision of church growth." This describes the course we took, a significant amount of the work that has been done, and the primary focus of my administration.

2) DISTRICT CONVENTIONS

Focusing the Church on its mission began with taking the vision to all the districts of the Apostolic Assembly. We, the General Board, accomplished this by attending all the district conventions celebrated in 2023. Aside from all the administrative and constitutional responsibilities at those conventions, the General Board members and I shared with the pastoral body the direction the Apostolic Assembly would take in the next four years. The focus would be on building the Church, with a particular emphasis on the Strategy of Jesus. We have done this without faltering for the last two years of our administration.

3) ORGANIZED AND RECOMMISSIONED THE STRATEGY OF JESUS COMMITTEE

Upon forming the Committee of the Strategy of Jesus, I appointed myself as the committee chairman because I felt the vision had to be led by the General Pastor of the Church. A vision cannot succeed if the primary leader is not at the ship's helm directing the Church toward the vision. He must be its chief promoter and vision caster. For greater efficiency, I hired an administrator to assist with the tedious and vital work on all the matters of the Strategy of Jesus. Aside from myself, the members of this committee are Bishop Elias Paez, administrator (Mazatlan, MX), Bishop Gabriel Calderon (Washington), Bishop David Martinez (Tacochimona, MX), Pastor Jimmy Morales (San Diego), Pastor Jonathan Quezada (Las Vegas), and Missionary Gabriel Pereira das Neves (Portugal). Bishops Armando Tamez and Ismael Martin del Campo also played an important role. These men were instrumental in promoting the Church's vision throughout the United States and the nations where the Apostolic Assembly has a banner. The Strategy of Jesus has advanced significantly in these two years of ministry and has gained wider acceptance.

4) NATIONAL SEMINARS

In 2024, the Committee of the Strategy of Jesus and other Pastors and leaders gave training seminars in 8 regions of the United States. We promoted the Vision nationally and internationally. The Regional Seminars were celebrated in the following States.

- February 23-24 -Charlotte, NC.
- March 1-2 -Baltimore, MD.
- April 5-6 -Chicago, IL.
- April 12-13 -Fresno, CA.
- April 19-20 -Florida
- April 26-27 -Pomona, CA.

5) INTERNATIONAL SEMINARS

The vision of the Apostolic Assembly is an international vision that is bearing fruit in the world. An essential part of the work in the first two years was reaffirming and establishing the Church's global vision. We accomplished this by sending teams to the international field twenty-seven times to support the vision of the Strategy of Jesus and offering seminars and training. The team gave workshops in the following countries: Canada, Panama, Venezuela, Puerto Rico, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Paraguay, Uruguay, Brazil, Peru, Chile, Cuba, Asia, and Africa. A team of coaches did an excellent job motivating and instructing the Pastors and the church membership.

6) THE CHRONOGRAM IN THE NATIONAL CALENDAR

For the first time in our Assembly's history, we put the SOJ Chronogram in the national calendar. This was done for three reasons: first, to give the Church's vision greater prominence; second, to offer common dates for the major components of the Strategy of Jesus so the Pastors who were beginning to implement the vision could synchronize their calendars and work together; and finally, to give the vision a greater likelihood of being implemented. The activities placed on the calendar are the ones that get done.

7) THE GROWTH TRACK

In June of 2023, we asked the Pastors to begin to submit monthly growth reports. We asked them to report on water baptisms, Holy Spirit baptisms, and the number of cell groups in their local Churches. The Growth Track Report was created to give the Pastors a means for providing an account for their work in the local churches. Accountability is essential for the health of any organization. It is a mechanism for producing our best work. To date, it has served to have healthy, targeted discussions with Church leaders of the state of the local churches in the Apostolic Assembly.

The "Growth Track" reports have made the church leadership aware of the Apostolic Assembly's current state month after month. They have highlighted the healthy churches and other churches that need attention.

The statistics, in conjunction with our conversations with district leaders, indicate that churches with an evangelism and discipleship strategy are growing. They also show us that the churches without an evangelism and discipleship plan have hit a growth ceiling or are in decline. The details will be seen in the 2022 and 2023 census reports. The reasons for this inertia and decline are complex but manageable. It is too early to conclude the precise percentages of growth our efforts will produce in the long term, but we know we are growing.

8) COACHING PASTORS AND BISHOPS

Members of the committee mentored and coached Pastors who requested personalized training on implementing the Jesus strategy. This personalized training pinpointed specific areas that needed to be reinforced for the vision to progress. The mentors worked with the pastors and Bishops to maximize efficiency.

9) **PUBLICATIONS**

A team of writers, editors, and publishers worked tirelessly to produce 144 PowerPoint presentations to present at the Regional Seminars and train the local churches in the Church's vision. The team produced the following manuals:

- 1. Build the Church Mission
- 2. Advanced Strategy of Jesus Manual
- 3. New Birth Manual
- 4. Grow Manual
- 5. Mature Manual
- 6. Multiply Manual
- 7. Build the Church Holy Spirit Regional Seminar Manual.

10) FIFTY-TWO LESSONS FOR CELL GROUPS AND DISCIPLESHIP MANUALS

In support of the Church's cellular vision, the team published two books of 52 Spanish and English lessons for the cell groups, one for every week of the year for 2023 and 2024. The team also published two sets of discipleship manuals, each consisting of four discipleship books. The purpose was to provide materials for consolidating new church members.

11) 2024 AND 2025 CHRONOGRAM

I included the Chronogram in the National Calendar. This was important as a guide for the districts and local churches. It made the Strategy of Jesus a priority activity in the Apostolic Assembly. The Chronogram synchronizes the efforts of the local churches attempting to implement the Assembly's vision. As an army marching in locked steps, the churches of the Apostolic Assembly are working together to win the lost, disciple new believers, and commission the saints.

These things represent a significant amount of work that has involved many people and required a considerable investment. These efforts and initiatives have caused the Church in many sectors to focus on its mission of reaching our communities with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Much work still needs to be done, given that an important number of churches have not yet engaged in the vision. We are, nevertheless, unwavering in our commitment to see the vision advance.

III. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Constitutional Requirements

In this section of the report, I will inform our Church's pastoral body on the President's major constitutional responsibilities. They are the following:

1) REPRESENTING THE CHURCH AND SUPERVISING BISHOPS (ARTICLE 7, CLAUSE I).

I have represented the Apostolic Assembly when required to do so in all legal, business, and ecclesiastical meetings. I have presided over district and national conventions, directed district elections, and assigned representatives when it was not possible for me to attend. I held business meetings and personally met with the bishops to advise them about proper protocol and their constitutional responsibilities. I have taught the Pastoral body and District Boards regarding church growth and helped the district boards resolve urgent problems affecting the health of their districts. I have prayed with and for the district board members and Pastors, and many other things having to do with the supervision of the districts.

2) PRESIDE OVER CHURCH MEETINGS (ARTICLE 7, CLAUSE III).

I have presided over all 22 Regular Meetings of the General Board, including six extraordinary meetings. I have also presided over one Legislative convention held in Anaheim, California, in November 2023. I have also presided over three Joint Bishops' Meetings.

3) DISTRICTS CONVENTIONS AND ADVISOR TO THE BISHOPS (ARTICLE 7, CLAUSE IV, IX)

The constitution requires the President to advise the district bishops. I have done two things to fulfill this responsibility: Beginning this year, the General Board and I have had monthly meetings with the bishops. These meetings aim to improve the communication between the Bishops and the General Board. During these meetings, the National and District Boards express their concerns, ask questions, or make any comments they think are necessary. This has opened an important new line of communication.

Second, the Board members and I meet with the bishops and their boards each month to review growth statistics. In those meetings, we review the Growth Track reports and consider the growing churches and those that are not growing. We discuss what can be done to help churches that are not growing. Essentially, we have opened an avenue of communication to evaluate the growth of the districts and define ways to support local churches in their mission. As part of their monthly report, the General Board members inform the President of the status of the districts.

4) THE CONFEDERATIONS (ARTICLE 7, CLAUSE V, VI).

The Constitution requires the President to advise the confederation leaders. To ensure the confederations' needs were met, I assigned a General Board member as an advisor to each confederation board. The advisors are responsible for informing me of the confederations' needs, requests, and concerns. They reported those concerns or questions at our monthly General Board Meetings. I also made myself available to meet with any Confederation leader to advise them on any critical matters and met with them to review and approve their budgets and work plans for the year. Representation (Article 7, Clause VIII).

I have represented the Apostolic Assembly in all negotiations and official proceedings where my presence was required. When I could not attend, I assigned a General Board Member to represent me.

5) GENERAL REPORT AND STATISTICAL

Our administration has complied with all the agreements made at General Conventions, Joint Bishops, and Bishops' Meetings. The General Secretary will report on the Church's statistical data in greater detail (Article 7, Clause XI).

6) BUDGET AND WORK PLAN

The General Board and I have presented a full budget and work plan for the last two years at the September Joint Bishops' Meeting. For the first time, we were able to present a General Budget that included an individual budget for all eight members of the General Board of Directors (Article 7, Clause XII).

7) CADS AND CAIM

The CADS and CAIM commissions were assigned at the beginning of our administration. The CAIM Commission is fully functioning. The CADS Commission, however, has been delayed until this legislative convention due to the commission not having been given clear direction for resolving the cases presented to them. (Article 7, Clause XIII)

8) GENERAL BOARD EVALUATION

For the first time in our Assembly's history, the General Board will be evaluated by an independent commission comprised of a former President, Ex-Board members, and Bishops in function. The purpose is to have the work of the General Board members evaluated independently and individually so that the members of this administration can offer the Lord our best work. Independent evaluation is central to excellence.

9) INTERNATIONAL TRIPS

During the first two years of my administration, I visited the following countries to supervise and keep myself personally apprised of the needs in the mission field.

- February 2024 Panama Convention
- May 2024 Cuba SOJ Trip

IV. MY GRATITUDE

Finally, I want to express my profound gratitude to those who have contributed significantly to the work that has been done. To my wife, Rose, I owe an outstanding debt of gratitude. Since we were married and throughout my service to the Lord and his Church, she has not failed to give me her full support. My calling would not have been entirely realized without her at my side. She has been the bedrock of my ministry, sacrificially giving of herself as a helpmeet so that I could fulfill God's calling on my life.

To the General Board members, I thank you for your friendship and for believing in the vision that the Lord has given our Church. The members of the General Board have done an outstanding job in their areas of responsibility. The work that has been done was a team effort. Each member of the Board has contributed significantly to the progress that has been accomplished.

VICE PRESIDENT. BISHOP JOSEPH RODRIGUEZ

Bishop Joseph Rodriguez has been a faithful advisor; his counsel, experience as a corporate executive, and wisdom have been a deep well from which I have drawn when I needed clarity regarding essential church matters.

GENERAL SECRETARY, BISHOP ISMAEL MARTIN DEL CAMPO

Bishop Ismael Martin del Campo's meticulous attention to detail and outstanding work ethic have expedited the flow of information from the General Board to the body of Pastors and Bishops, resulting in greater efficiency. He's greatly improved the General Secretary's Office.

GENERAL TREASURER, BISHOP ANDY PROVENCIO

Bishop Andy Provencio's integrity and his team's proficiency have kept the Apostolic Assembly's finances healthy and beyond reproach. The income to the General Fund has continued to grow under his administration.

SECRETARY OF INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS, BISHOP STEVE MORAN

Bishop Steve Moran's love for souls, our missionaries, and the kingdom's expansion in the mission field has resulted in the growth of the number of nations with an Apostolic banner. International Missions continues to grow at an accelerated pace.

SECRETARY OF NATIONAL MISSIONS, BISHOP FRANCISCO QUEZADA

Bishop Francisco Quezada has led the National Missions Department to become the fastest-growing region of our Assembly in the United States. Their growth has been admirable.

SECRETARY OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION, BISHOP ARMANDO TAMEZ

Bishop Armando Tamez has pushed the Department of Christian Education to new horizons. He's expanded its vision. He has introduced innovative programs and initiatives that are preparing the Church to confront future challenges.

SECRETARY OF SOCIAL ASSISTANCE, BISHOP SAM ROJAS

Bishop Sam Rojas has advocated for the Pastors and the families of our Church and efficiently provided for their needs with a Pastor's heart. He has a heart for the leaders of our Church.

EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT. PASTOR JONATHAN GARZA

As my assistant, Pastor Jonathan Garza has faithfully performed much of the "behind the scenes" work that is essential to effective leadership. His loyalty, integrity, and capacity for getting things done have made my job easier.

DIRECTOR OF THE STRATEGY OF JESUS, BISHOP ELIAS PAEZ

Finally, I want to thank Bishop Elias Paez for his outstanding contribution. His persistence and commitment to advancing the Church's vision have been exceptional. In many ways, he has worked at the forefront and, at times, quietly behind the scenes to advance The Strategy of Jesus around the world. He is a man driven by a vision and a desire to see the Apostolic Assembly effectively reach the world with the Gospel, disciple believers, and send disciples.

All of these good men and many more who serve the Apostolic Assembly on the General Board and in other areas of responsibility love the Church and its Pastors. Their commitment to giving their best and working together has proven time and again that they are committed to a greater cause than themselves.

V. CONCLUSION

I'll conclude this report by stating that the Church is growing. The following are the total membership numbers of the Apostolic Assembly in the United States, as recorded in the General Convention Reports since 2014. What they show is the beginning of what undoubtedly will be a significant growth trend. The effort we have put into the Church's vision is beginning to bear fruit.

- 2014 87,499 total members in the US
- 2015 89,713 total members in the US
- 2017 89,104 total members in the US
- 2019 80,290 total members in the US
- 2021 76,962 total members in the US
- 2022 79,531 total members in the US
 2023 83,442 total members in the US

The membership numbers for 2022 and 2023 show the beginning of a vital and what I believe will be a sustained and escalating advance. Jesus said he would build the Church, and he is. The Church is heading into a season of growth. I anticipate that the future reports will demonstrate the fruit of the investment put into the Church's vision. As I have traveled the nation, I have been greatly encouraged by a subtle but significant change in the Church's conversation. Almost everywhere I have gone, I have heard testimonies from Bishops and Pastors telling their stories. With great joy, they have told me of a renewed vision for winning souls and making disciples. Those impromptu stories give me great hope that the direction of our Church is right.

The future of the Apostolic Assembly is in the hands of its builder. I desire that God bless our Church, its leaders, and its people.

DUTIES OF THE BISHOP VICE PRESIDENT

ARTICLE 9 OF THE 2024 APOSTOLIC ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTION

He shall substitute the Bishop President when, for a justifiable reason, he cannot or should not continue with his duties. He shall preside over the General Conventions, General Board of Directors meetings, Joint Bishops Meetings, and Episcopal Meetings in the absence of the Bishop President. He shall attend any General or District Convention, in the country or abroad, with the representation of the Bishop President, and will carry out any other commission conferred upon him by the General Conventions or meetings of the General Board of Directors. In emergencies, he may intervene in problems presented by the district bishops and will immediately inform the Bishop President of any agreements reached.

The Bishop Vice President shall be the president of the Constitution Revision Commission and be the editor of the editions of the Constitution of the Apostolic Assembly.

The following is a condensed report of the work and accomplishments during my two-year tenure as the Vice President of the Apostolic Assembly as required in Article 25, Clause 7.

CONSTITUTION REVISION COMMISSION

I want to thank the Commission, Bishop Frank Balboa, Bishop Jose Castro, Bishop Gabriel Calderon, Bishop Omar Arzate, and Secretary, Pastor Ismael Martin del Campo III, for their dedication, sacrifices, and contribution to the success of maintaining the integrity and legality of the Apostolic Assembly Constitution.

The CRC published the 2024 edition of the Apostolic Assembly Constitution. The Commission's work comprised of:

- 12 Proposal Initiatives reviewed by the CRC in 2023
- 18 Proposal Initiatives processed by the CRC in 2024
- 5 Proposal Initiatives were approved by the 2023 convention and adopted into the Constitution's text. The CRC was directly responsible for these proposals.
- The commission established an archive of CRC files from the last ten years. These files are now available on the corporate server at headquarters.

GENERAL AND LEGISLATIVE CONVENTIONS

I served as President of the 2023 Legislative Convention and the 2024 General Convention. We have an outstanding team that works sacrificially to serve our Assembly with excellence to provide the best from the hotels to the arena platform. They are passionate about excellence and serve with humility.

I want to thank Sis. JoAnn Banda, for her professionalism and expertise in negotiating favorable contracts of the hosting hotels and Convention Center in Anaheim, CA. Great job!

I also thank Pastor Tim Arroyo, as Director of Operations. Pastor Tim is an amazing administrator, coordinating all the details of these massive conventions and, most importantly, keeping us within our budget. Thank you, Pastor Tim Arroyo!

JOINT BISHOP'S MEETINGS

With the help of our team, we organized the March 2023 JBM at the headquarters in Fontana, CA, the September 2023 and 2024 JBM's in Pomona, CA, and the March 2024 JBM via Zoom. Much gratitude and thanks to Pastor Jacob Rodriguez, Pastor Tim Arroyo, and Sis. JoAnn Banda for their work of excellence.

The members of this commission served with integrity and fear of God. The commission stayed within the guidelines of the C.A.I.M. Annex Document approved at the November 2021 Legislative Convention and ratified by the Ministerial Convention in November 2023. Each case was prayerfully and biblically considered.

The Commission of Appeals for Initiation to the Ministry received a total of 16 applications. Eleven (11) of the applicants were approved for initiation to ministry, and five (5) applicants were not approved.

The Commission is extremely grateful to have served on this important assignment to give an opportunity to young men who committed a moral sin at a very young age that without doubt, have God's calling to the ministry upon their lives. With great care and humility, we give glory to God.

SAFE CHILDREN COMMISSION (AB506)

In response to the California AB506 law and its updated mandates, significant efforts have been made to ensure that all California districts and local assemblies within the Apostolic Assembly are fully compliant. Meetings were held with each of the eight California districts to review the law's requirements and establish a standardized process for implementation. These meetings helped church leaders understand the importance of background checks and the mandated training for all volunteers and staff working with children and youth. During these sessions, we also addressed specific questions and challenges faced by the districts, ensuring everyone is aligned with the new legal requirements.

A comprehensive approval process for the Live Scan background check system was established to facilitate the necessary fingerprinting and clearance for volunteers and staff. In 2023 and 2024, we processed 6,613 Live Scan applicants.

We developed customized forms for each local church to use for Live Scan submissions, along with reporting forms to document and track compliance efforts at the local level. Each local church now has the resources and processes to ensure that volunteers are properly screened before they begin working with children. Additionally, specific forms for reporting compliance were created to keep accurate records of Live Scan submissions and mandated reporter training completions.

We also ensured that all volunteers at the 8 California District Conventions, National Conventions, District Youth, and Junior camps were properly cleared through the Live Scan system and had completed the mandated reporter training as required by the law. Supporting documents were prepared to guide pastors on handling situations involving registered offenders in their congregations, with clear guidelines on protecting children and balancing the needs of the church community. These measures provide crucial safeguards to protect the children under our care while ensuring compliance with the state's legal requirements.

To further support our Pastors, we also prepared resources and guidance on how to manage situations involving registered offenders within the congregation while maintaining child safety. These proactive measures ensure that our churches are well-prepared to protect children and meet the legal standards set forth by the AB506 law. All licensed ministers, deacons, and children ministry volunteers are required to comply with Live Scanning.

I am the registered Custodian for the Apostolic Assembly with the Department of Justice of California for all live-scanning, protocols, reporting, and follow-up. I want to thank the commission members, Pastor Ben Pacheco and Sister Cherie Rodriguez, who are both also registered custodians with the DOJ of California. They both worked hard with much care and sensitivity to serve our California churches and keep our children safe. I am profoundly grateful for their dedication, professionalism, knowledge, and work ethic.

GENERAL MANAGER (HEADQUARTERS)

My assignment was to oversee all of the headquarters employees and policies. I thank the Human Resources Director, Pastor Eddie Campa, for his excellent work and dedication to the well-being of our employees. I also thank Minister Gabriel Gonzalez for his contribution to improvements made in favor of our employees.

As overseer of the maintenance and remodel of the headquarters facilities, I want to thank Gabriel Gonzalez for his excellent work in maintaining all of the contracts with various companies associated with the facilities and the continued remodel of the General Offices. Bro. Gabriel saved us thousands of dollars in negotiating better pricing with contractors.

MEDIA AND RECORDING STUDIO (ABBA)



I would like to share some highlights from our video production efforts. Our main focus has been creating and sharing content in both English and Spanish to reach a global audience. In 2024, we produced 162 videos, with Christian Education leading the way with 68 videos and International Missions following with 57. This reflects our commitment to both educating and expanding our reach.

On the digital front, we have seen great growth. Our YouTube subscribers jumped from 6,700 in 2022 to nearly 25,000 this year, with our total views climbing past 7 million. Interestingly, the videos focused on supporting our members, like **"The Access"** and **"The Flourish,"** made up only 10.5% of our content but brought in the most new subscribers and engagement. This shows just how important it is to keep creating content that connects directly with our people.

We have also made strides on social media, growing to 27,000 followers on Facebook, 15,300 on Instagram, and over 12,700 users on our app. Moving forward, we aim to keep a balance between global and local missions while continuing to focus on content that serves our members.

All glory to the King of kings and Lord of lords, Jesus Christ, who has cared for his Church in the midst of persecutions, wars, pandemics, natural disasters, financial catastrophes and social upheavals.

We are here, celebrating the 2024 General Convention, as proof of the great love and faithfulness of the Lamb of God towards the people he washed with his blood.

I thank God for the privilege of serving for 31 years as pastor of the Apostolic Assembly, four years as Bishop of the Los Angeles District, eight years as Secretary of Christian Education, four years as Vice President and now, two years as General Secretary. We are here to spend and wear ourselves out in the service of the Kingdom of God!

I thank my beautiful wife Oralia, for her love, unconditional support and prayers, in the 37 years we have shared as a married couple. Our marriage has fulfilled the divine mission of being useful to God. The love and prayers of my children Ismael III, Jasiel, my daughter-in-law Elizabeth and my granddaughters Hadassah and Elizabeth are fundamental in my life.

My thanks to our Bishop President Felipe Salazar, our Vice President Joseph Rodríguez and my colleagues on the General Board of Directors, for their support, prayers and teamwork during the past two years.

The history of our Assembly shows that our successes are due to the training and hard work of good teams. My applause to:

3. Minister Gabe González, for being an excellent and meticulous Administrator of the Real Estate Department and his excellent team: Daniel Jiménez, Real Estate Specialist; Isaac Riojas, Administrative Assistant and Esmeralda Rodríguez, Administrative Assistant.

4. Brother Dominic Moschetti for his excellent work on our website.

5. Lawyer Jorge Montes, for his excellent and constant advice on the legal consultations necessary for the General Secretariat and the Real Estate Department.

SERVICE WITH PRINCIPLES

Three principles have guided my service to our Apostolic Assembly, these principles I have expressed since the 1994 Ministerial Convention:

- 1. That Jesus our Lord be the center of everything we do. The only one who receives our adoration and fidelity.
- 2. That the perfect Word of God should examine and guide everything we do in the Apostolic Assembly.

3. And being of service to the pastors, since they are the key leaders of their congregation. It is in the health of the local church where the strength of the Apostolic Assembly lies. Pastors are our strategic partners for the Mission of the Church.

1. COMMUNICATIONS: DECEMBER 2022 TO OCTOBER 2024.

1.1. MINUTES:

• I wrote in English and sent 23 minutes of ordinary meetings of the General Board of Directors, for a total of 984 pages and we prepared 23 agendas in English for these meetings.

• These minutes incorporate the complete reports of each of the eight members, thus creating a historical resource.

• We also prepared and sent 184 monthly action items to the eight members of the Board of Directors in the last 23 months.

• I wrote and sent 18 minutes of extraordinary meetings of the General Board of Directors.

• I prepared and sent, in English and Spanish, three minutes of the Joint Meeting of Bishops and one Episcopal Meeting, a total of 126 pages.

- I prepared and sent 8 minutes and 8 agendas for the monthly Episcopal Meetings in 2024.
- We prepared in English and Spanish and sent the minutes of the 2023 Legislative Convention, 24 pages.

1.2. BULK EMAILS (EBLASTS):

• The Communications Department, under my responsibility, sent two hundred mass emails, covering a variety of subjects.

• I personally prepared and sent 67 of these mass emails with official notices to the Bishops, Pastors and members of our churches.

1.3. OFFICIAL LETTERS AND EMAILS:

The role of the General Secretary requires a constant sending of official communications. In the last 23 months I have sent 6,480 emails with official notices, agreements of the General Board of Directors, meeting reminders, responsibilities and official responses. My Outlook application does me the favor of tracking this.
Even with all my best efforts, I apologize to those that I may have been unable to email back.

1.4. VIDEO-MESSAGES.

• I prepared and shared 15 video messages in 2023 and 7 video messages in 2024, for official communications, urgent information and resources for pastors.

1.5. PHONE CALLS.

• We responded to just over five thousand phone calls from pastors and bishops in the past two years, addressing different needs.

• All the previous numbers are not extraordinary, but rather necessary for fulfilling the duties of the General Secretariat.

2. DEPARTMENT OF MINISTERIAL DOCUMENTS.

2.1. CREDENTIALS, LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES 2023

- This is the list of ministerial IDs that we processed and sent in 2023.
- This indicates that 676 pastors, pastors-in-charge or ministers-in-charge applied for their 2023 credential.

• There were 113 pastors, pastors-in-charge or ministers-in-charge missing to apply for their ministerial credential in 2023.

2.2. ONLINE APPLICATION FOR CREDENTIALS, LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES 2024.

• We set a goal of digitally processing all credentials, licenses and certificates by 2024. The General Board of Directors approved the cost to make this transition.

• From 2024 onward, all our ministry documents will be processed electronically, saving thousands of dollars each year.

• Currently, we are completing all applications for credentials, licenses and certificates, electronically, with the help of Bishops, District Secretaries, Elders and Pastors.

• As of October 23, 2024, we had 1,849 ministers and initiates registered to the online credentials portal and already the 2024 applications have generated \$192,875.00.

• Bishops and pastors, let us ensure that our 789 ministerial credentials are processed in 2024.

2.3. DIGITAL CREDENTIALS, LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES.

• We set a goal for digital credentials, licenses and certificates. This idea was approved by the General Board of Directors.

• We were able to negotiate this process and obtain a savings of \$26,500 dollars from the original cost.

• By the end of 2024 we will provide everyone with their digital ministerial document card.

• In 2024, we will digitally provide the district board members with their ministerial credentials, which can be placed in the "Wallet" app on iPhone or Android phones.

• In 2025 the ministerial card and digital identification will be available to all pastors and this will also allow thousands of dollars to be saved each year.

3. CORPORATE LETTERS.

• From December 2022 to October 2024, we prepared and provided hundreds of corporate letters for our missionaries, for real estate processes and for different procedures with government offices at the state and federal level.

• From January to December 2023, we prepared and provided 128 corporate letters for banking procedures.

• From January to October 2024, we prepared and provided 74 corporate letters for banking procedures.

• I personally read and approve each corporate letter, due to the seriousness of these matters.

4. SEMINARS FOR DISTRICT SECRETARIES.

• We held the 2023 Seminar for District Secretaries, in person and with access via Zoom, on October 17, in Rancho Cucamonga, CA.

• We held the 2024 Seminar for District Secretaries, also in person and with access via Zoom, on April 9 and 10, in Rancho Cucamonga, CA.

5. INSURANCE DEPARTMENT.

The biggest challenge we have is to ensure that all churches, missions and new works, whether they rent or own their building, have liability insurance protection and against child sexual abuse and sexual harassment.
The large number of natural disasters in recent years has raised costs for all of our churches and even

made it difficult for some of them to obtain insurance.

• When a congregation, regardless of its size, does not have insurance, it is at great risk, but so is our entire organization.

• Bishop and pastors, we are going to do everything necessary so that all our congregations have insurance.

6. APOSTOLIC CHURCH INSURANCE.

• When the formation of Apostolic Mutual was proposed, to fund loans for our churches, it seemed like a very distant goal. But today it is an institution that blesses a growing number of churches.

• I have begun the exploration of creating our own insurance company and will present a proposal for a first stage to the General Board of Directors for approval

- We already have market research. We know the type of insurance our churches need; we serve 789 congregations.

- We have already identified the regions where it is most difficult for our churches to obtain insurance.

- We know the price differences between Brotherhood Mutual, Guide One and Church Mutual, the major providers.

- We are compiling regulations for an insurance company specializing in churches, in California and Texas, where we should start this project.

• Bishops and pastors, we ask for your prayers for the Apostolic Church Insurance project.

7. WORKER'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE.

- 2022: All districts and their churches complied with having this insurance.
- 2023: All districts complied with the payment and registration of their churches.
- 2024: All districts have complied with the payment and registration of their churches.

8. REAL ESTATE DEPARTMENT:

8.1. PROCESS MONITORING.

• Following up on each real estate process request produces a daily flow of dozens of emails between our team, bishops, pastors, banks and real estate agents, and escrow companies.

• I received a copy of all those emails. I am in constant communication with our team and work with them when there are obstacles in any of our processes.

• For the past two years I have met in person or virtually, each month, with pastors and bishops to provide additional help and, in special cases, I have traveled to evaluate properties in person in California, Texas and Florida.

8.2. FACILITATING REAL ESTATE PROCESSES.

• We prepared and presented six new modifications to the Real Estate Manual, in English and Spanish, and these were approved by the September 2023 Joint Meeting.

• These six modifications were to facilitate and simplify the lease procedures that pastors must carry out.

• At the 2022 General Convention, I will present a new proposal-initiative to facilitate the leasing process for pastors.

• We are studying the possibility of leaving the final resolution for leases in the hands of the district boards, to save one more step in these processes. Bishops and District Secretaries have expressed themselves in favor of this change and we will present the proposal, maintaining the necessary protection for our corporation.

• I have signed all the documents for the real estate processes, thousands of pages, duly reviewed by our team, as soon as the documents are produced. We observe a special diligence for these processes.

• Below is a summary of the real estate processes we carried out:

• I have followed up, creating files, working with our lawyers, informing the General Board of Directors and executing their agreements, in 21 legal cases, in the past 23 months.

• Thirteen of those cases have already been concluded, thanks be to God. In one we reached a financial settlement. Another was covered by the church's insurance. And a third was resolved by local church resources.

• We have eight open cases. We hope it is resolved by the insurance. Two are in favor of the Assembly and are in the hands of our lawyers. We have an active case in the Superior Court of California. And we hope that the remaining four cases will be resolved without major complications.

• Additionally, we are aware of five other situations, working with our bishops and lawyers so that they are resolved without legal complications.

• 80% of all the cases mentioned have to do with situations that occurred 50, 30, 20 or 10 years ago.

• At the request of President Salazar, I supervised the Christian Education department for two months, at the end of 2023, while Bishop Tamez suffered an illness.

14 GROWTH TRACK REPORTS.

We have requested and received all monthly reports from the districts and have sent the national report to all Bishops Supervisors and Regional Elders each month.

Their commitment to excellence has greatly benefited the pastors and congregations of our beloved assembly.

The combined efforts of this finance team have supported the work of the General Board of Directors as they fulfill their responsibilities.

TASKS OF THE GENERAL TREASURER

In accordance with Article 12 of the Apostolic Assembly Constitution, I have diligently sought to fulfill the responsibilities of the General Treasurer, which include:

- Overseeing all funds received.
- Maintaining accurate financial records for all income and expenses.
- Ensuring that all approved disbursements are made with appropriate documentation.
- Providing certified financial reports to the General Convention, as well as monthly reports to the General Board of Directors.
- Regularly distributing the tithes of tithes reports.

With the support of the Accounting Department, we have faithfully executed these responsibilities in alignment with the principles of the Apostolic Assembly Constitution. Our commitment to transparency and integrity continues to guide our work, ensuring that we serve our organization effectively and honorably.

FINANCIALS

In the spirit of transparency, I present the Financial Report for the calendar years 2022, 2023, and 2024. Although I formally took office in November 2022, I felt it was important to report the entire calendar year of 2022 to give a

The Income Statement Summary details the total income and expenses of the Apostolic Assembly up to August 2024. This includes major programs and departments within our organization, such as International Missions, National Missions, Christian Education, Social Assistance, the National Confederations, and the Bible College. Please note that the AC Nava Foundation and Apostolic Mutual operate as subordinate organizations to the Assembly, and their financials are reported separately, not included in this summary.

Based on the financial summary presented, the Apostolic Assembly has posted positive net income over the past three years, which is a testament to the growth of our organization. In 2023, we realized a \$3,211,636 in net income and in 2024 through August, a \$1,124,161 net income.

TITHES OF TITHES

Over the past several years, the Apostolic Assembly has experienced steady growth in Tithes of Tithes contributions from local churches. In the past 2 years we have experienced a 7% increase in tithes. For the first time in our history, we anticipate reaching the six million dollar mark by the end of the year. We give all the honor and glory to God for this significant achievement.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all the pastors of the local churches for their continued faithfulness and support. With ongoing church growth and accountability, we believe we will maintain this upward trajectory into 2025.


BUILDING OUR FUND RESERVES

As we face challenging times and unforeseen circumstances, it is essential to make strategic decisions to bolster our fund reserves. In September 2024, during the Joint Bishops Meeting, the Episcopal Body approved a budget that includes several cuts to travel and meeting expenses. Our goal is to save one million dollars to be added to our General Fund Reserves, with these changes taking effect in January 2025. As of August 2024, we currently have 3.5 million dollars in reserves.

To ensure effective management of our finances, we have implemented plans for rigorous budget monitoring. We aim to hold monthly budget meetings with all departments and confederations to promote accountability and transparency.

We have received more than \$15M over the past 32 months.

We are projecting to hit \$6m at the end of 2024



AC NAVA FOUNDATION AND APOSTOLIC MUTUAL

As mentioned earlier in my report, both the AC Nava Foundation and Apostolic Mutual report separately due to the nature of their organizations. Currently, AC Nava holds over \$868,602 dollars in operating cash and reserves, which support retired pastors, widows of deceased pastors, general relief, and various other programs. Please see the financial report for 2023 and 2024 for the AC Nava Foundation which highlights the program expenses showing higher concentrations in Retired Pastors Assistance and Widows Assistance which has resulted in net losses.

This type of internship will be a preparation for if, in the future, they want to go out as a formal missionary.

Providing a short-term opportunity to go out and impact the Mission Field, Evangelist Mingo Garcia has organized, with excellence, these mission trips whereby, over the years, there have been more than 2500 participants. These trips have not only served to be blessings wherever they go but also to those who pass through a mentorship of formation and equipping with the goal that they return to their local church, encouraged, with the vision of reaching the lost. Thank you so much to all the teams for their positive impact!

VIII. PRECIOUS HEARTS

Another new ministry that we have launched is that of Precious Hearts. This non-profit organization has been formed with the goal of providing better opportunities for those children of the world for their education and self-improvement in those communities of limited resources in an Apostolic faith-based effort.

In Kenya, we are lifting up the walls of our first Apostolic Orphanage/School, which, with the help of the Lord, we will be able to complete in 2025. We have already received help from the outside community that desires to donate to humanitarian causes, not churches. The prayer is that we will be able to connect with corporations, businessmen, and businesswomen who desire to donate to such corresponding causes.

IX. APOSTOLIC INTERNATIONAL TALENTS

The vision here is to discover those within the Apostolic Assembly world who desire to unite with others in their area of labor to organize and work on projects around the world that would bring a focused ministration. The purpose of these workshops is for each region to engage in the national vision and thus schedule the evangelistic cycle and promote the planting of new works in all the National Missions Regions. Thank God we have been able to see the result of growth in the five Regions of the national mission field. Below, we present the dates on which these workshops were held.

2023

March 3-4, 2023: Southeast Region. March 10-11, 2023: Mid Central America. March 17-18, 2023: Ohio. March 25-26, 2023: New England. April 21-22, 2023: Mid America North.

2024

July 12-13, 2024: North. June 14-15, 2024: Southeast. July 26-27, 2024: New England. August 2-3, 2024: Ohio. August 16-17, 2024: Central.

NATIONAL EVANGELISM CONGRESS

We had the opportunity to have our first National Evangelism Congress. This took place on April 12 and 13, 2024, in Las Vegas, NV. With a total attendance of 100 brothers. IX. OBJECTIVES 2025-2026

2. Create a coalition to formulate a work plan with each bishop and respective district for the Planting of new works and reaching 1000 churches and works in our country.

3. Reach 30% growth and plant 25 more new works in the five Regions through the National Strategy of Jesus program.

Secondly, it is a great privilege to be allowed to deliver the following report on the work of the Secretariat of Christian Education (SCE). My prayer is that the results reflected in this report, which are the fruits of two years of the hard work and effort of many brothers and sisters who have joined in the academic plans and projects, will succeed in honoring the vote of confidence given to me at the 2022 Convention. I write this report with a heart full of gratitude and excitement; it represents in a very brief way because it is impossible to transmit on paper and ink the more than 15 coordinations that actively and with great diligence from the SCE Committee. We continue to establish the work structures that support the challenging vision given by our Bishop President Felipe Salazar for our Apostolic Assembly: To become a growing, healthy, cellular, and Spirit-filled church. It is a vision that is uniting and motivating us to enter into new realms of training, accountability, support, and focus. These guidelines are what will allow us to expand to over 1,000 congregations in the United States and continue to support expansion in every country of the world. It is a powerful move that transcends numbers; it allows us to see, seize, and create opportunities for the particular times we are living in. The Secretariat of Christian Education, joining this goal, is taking the necessary steps to go beyond traditional structures, seeking to implement innovative programs and projects that are more effective, economical, and accessible to all. The new generations that are in our congregations are represented by a digital, virtual, and AI (Artificial Intelligence) culture; the use of cybernetic technology is already routine and part of their daily lives. The church has to take advantage of these means to present a relevant and innovative message. Education, in general, is facing a great crisis, and the field of Christian Education is not exempt from this phenomenon; thus, it is urgent that more contemporary methodologies and procedures be established in the apostolic biblical teaching models.

The mission of building the Church relies heavily on integral growth, meaning that numerical advancement must be aligned with knowledge and understanding of biblical apostolic principles (discipleship). This is where Christian Education plays a relevant role by creating academic programs that respond to such growth. ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF AND CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

 - REPORTS OF THE COORDINATORS AND THE STATUS OF THEIR PROJECTS

INTERNATIONAL APOSTOLIC BIBLE COLLEGE - IABC

In the year 2023, historically, the first woman in the administrative and academic position as Dean of IABC was appointed for the first time, Dr. Janae Quezada, who has served in this role for more than 18 months, working with the districts and theological seminaries with which we have academic agreements. Dean Quezada directs the operations and functions of IABC through the 33 directors, 25 of them in the District Campuses, 5 in the national regions, 1 online English, and 2 in the specialty campuses, and we also assist 12 International Campuses.

APOSTOLIC ASSEMBLY GENERAL CONVENTION 2024 // BIENNIAL REPORTS

IABC - 2023

IABC in 2023 supervised 39 Campuses. In the 31 National Campuses, 25 graduations were attended with 627 graduates. At the 8 International Campuses, 6 graduations were attended with 302 graduates. A total of 929 students graduated.

IABC - 2024

In the current year, IABC oversees 44 Campuses. In the 30 National Campuses, we will attend 14 graduations with 250 graduates. In IABC online, we will have 6 graduates. In the 2 IABC Campuses with a specialty in church growth, their graduations will be the next year, 2025.

This is a historic year, as we have over 1500 students currently enrolled. The IABC, online/English, has 36 students. In the IABC Church Growth, we have the San Diego, CA. Campus with 79 students and the Mazatlán, Mex. campus with 138 students enrolled.

We are exploring a project specializing in IABC in "Church Planting" in the National Missions regions.

ACADEMIC SOFTWARE – CENTRAL CAMPUS PILOT PROGRAM

IABC is implementing a pilot program at the Central Campus for academic records, with the intention of extending it to all district campuses. This will facilitate the collection of updated and immediate information and, at the same time, ensure that the information is archived in a secure and organized manner, avoiding the loss of pertinent information for graduating students or those who did not finish their courses and seek to retake them at a later date. We currently have 144 students enrolled.

ANNUAL DISTRICT CAMPUS DIRECTORS' WORKSHOP

This annual workshop has become the center of training and development. New teaching and learning techniques are explored, new technological resources are presented, operational systems are shared among different districts, and the importance of Education in preparing candidates for ministry and Apostolic membership in general is emphasized. In the year 2023, it was held in the city of Dallas, Texas, and 24 of the 28 directors attended. This year, 2024, was held in Las Vegas, NV., and we had the participation of 29 of the 31 directors.

IABC WITH SPECIALTIES IN CHURCH GROWTH

A new paradigm at the IABC is Campuses with specialties. Supporting the cellular vision that is being developed and implemented in all congregations inside and outside the United States, we concluded that it was necessary to go beyond the regional trainings, cellular seminars, and workshops held at the national conventions. These activities have been very successful, but it was necessary to implement a curriculum of academic character and recognition that would offer an alternative preparation for leaders who are fully involved in the Strategy of Jesus. I am referring to having classrooms where they will speak their language, express a vision of outreach, and provide them with the necessary expansion tools to continue developing their cell leadership. It was presented and approved at the General Board meeting in February 2023 and then by the Joint Bishop's Meeting in March 2023. After evaluating the centers and leaders that had the trajectory, experience, and infrastructure for the implementation of these pilot programs, in October of the same year, two campuses were approved with a specialization in Church Growth, the first one in Mazatlán, Sinaloa, Mexico and the second one in San Diego, CA.

• The Sinaloa Campus has a hybrid program in which it has on-site classes from La Misión, Mazatlán and extends online to the Caribbean, Central America, and countries in the Central Region and will soon be extended to South America, with 92 on-site students and more than 300 online students.

• The San Diego Campus is also a hybrid program with on-site classes at Tabernacle of Faith, San Diego, and online classes throughout the United States. It currently has 41 on-site and 38 online students, and the goal is to expand the curriculum to the fields of Europe, Africa, and India.

THE IABC ONLINE IN ENGLISH

This year, 2024, a new director of the online classes was appointed, Elder Steven Rodriguez, who immediately revolutionized the program, forming a team to update the courses in English and promote this program more effectively in the districts where there are challenges due to language, distance, schedules, etc. At the moment, there are 36 students, and the goal is to finish this year with 50 students and expand to 100 students by next year. At the moment, we only have the first two years corresponding to an Associate's degree.

IABC ONLINE 2025

For the next academic year:

- 1. We will offer the Bachelor's degree in English online;
- 2. We are preparing the material to offer online courses in Spanish Associate's and Bachelor's.

POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMS

The Secretariat of Christian Education, through the scholarship program, currently has students pursuing graduate studies at the following universities:

Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary, McCormick Theological Seminary, Kairos International University, Urshan Graduate School of Theology, Fuller Theological Seminary.

Since 2023, a total of 38 graduate scholarships have been awarded. We currently have 18 students pursuing a Master's degree and 20 pursuing a Doctorate.

IABC - 2025

• A committee of former IABC deans was formed to develop a manual of guidelines and procedures for campus directors & students.

- Continue to explore innovative ways of teaching that support our teachers and motivate our students at the District Campuses.
- Implement programs that allow for more effective transmission of information.
- Update textbooks.
- Support directors to raise academic standards in the districts.
- Central Campus extensions will be opened in the districts that compose it.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Dr. Lisa Marroquin will be initiating the IABC Alumni Association at all levels: District Campuses, specialties, online, masters, and doctorate. This new project will allow the creation of a much-needed and urgent "Graduate Network" of men and women that we need to connect them in the field they trained in: Christian Education.

THE GIFT OF THE TEACHER

Promote the recognition and appreciation of the teacher's gift (teaching). Create a national committee that specializes in the formation of teachers and instructors that, through training, literature, and national workshops, teachers (men and women) of local churches, districts, and at all academic levels will be trained.

COORDINATION OF APOSTOLIC LITERATURE

Bishop Dr. Omar Arzate heads the Apostolic Literature Committee, which is composed of a select group of writers who produce Apostolic educational materials. A total of 6 Apostolic books have been published this year digitally; 3 in English and 3 in Spanish. These books have been directed to adults, youth, and children. These books have focused on the power of the Holy Spirit and Apostolic Doctrine. These lessons are intended for use in local church classes as well as for friendship groups. The Apostolic Literature Committee is working with the Christian Education Bookstore to release these materials digitally through the online bookstore.

DIGITAL SUBSCRIPTION

The Christian Education Bookstore has launched a digital subscription that will give access to the new Apostolic books, the Jesus Strategy discipleship manuals, the 2024 constitution, the Apostolic Herald, and many other materials. We encourage all pastors to purchase this subscription, as these materials will be a great resource for their congregations. The transition from physical to digital formats is a task that transcends the printed material; it is a transition from traditional culture and formats to new contemporary habits of study materials, and with every change, there will always be a challenge. But we are firm in motivating and promoting new ways of acquiring materials and how to use them. The digital format provides an academic library on one electronic device, fast in its acquisition and distribution, it is economical and accessible to all congregations and their membership, under a minimum subscription, it allows a presentation through monitors or digital screens, it is easier to print, you can copy and paste paragraphs, etc. It avoids storage of materials, shipping costs, and waiting time; it is automatic and immediate; no intermediaries are needed; avoids illegal copying, etc.

IABC NATIONAL WRITERS COORDINATOR

Bishop Dr. Roberto Tinoco is leading a team of writers focused specifically on updating the IABC books. This update is comprehensive, encompassing revision, expansion, and new topics. So far, three of the first year's books have been completed, and we currently have seven that are at least 50% complete. We are grateful for the \$1,500.00 sponsorship sent by each District Campus to help fund these updates. The goal is to transition from the written/pdf format to an interactive electronic format, which is known as an "e-book." We are in the early stages, and publishing these formats is not cheap, but we are confident that new times are coming for the Bible College and it will be able to subsidize itself financially, we are already in times where today's generations preferentially use electronic platforms, and we must be ready to offer these options.

IABC WRITERS - 2025

Finish the first 10 books of the first year and start the second year of the Associate.

APOSTOLIC HOMESCHOOL NETWORK

Director Maria Fernanda Zúñiga leads the Apostolic Homeschool Network committee. The main goal is to provide educational alternatives for Apostolic families in the face of the decline of public schools. She is working hard to create a community (Network) of Apostolic families who are currently homeschooling their children. In the two years of this administration, an informative website for the home school was established, and seven members became part of the team and held two informative workshops. The main goal is to be present in all districts.

APOSTOLIC CHRISTIAN ACADEMIES

Coordinator Elder Omar Cortez heads the Apostolic Christian Academies committee, whose objective is to motivate, support, and advise pastors to establish Christian academies in their local congregations. This committee held informative workshops via Zoom in January and October of this year and has also distributed informative materials to pastors who have shown interest in opening a Christian academy. It also seeks to create a network with those congregations that already have such programs to share resources and offer assistance in the process of preserving and expanding such academies. The objective is to provide a national platform of support and advice for the promotion and opening of Apostolic Christian Academies.

SCHOOL OF PASTORAL FORMATION

The Director, Bishop Jesse Valdez, leads the School of Pastoral Formation committee, two successful and transcendental conferences that have been carried out with the support and participation of all the members of the General Board, bishops, former bishops, and pastors who have demonstrated solid trajectories and deep influence in our Apostolic Assembly. The training consists of more than 36 sessions, including conferences for women, all of which are given completely in English and Spanish. The first year, 2023, we had a total of 176 attendees and 39 graduates, and this second year, 2024, we had a total of 140 attendees and 22 graduates. The objectives of this committee are to make the Pastoral Training School accessible to all ministers of each local church who aspire to pastoral ministry. The purpose of these trainings is to equip ministers in the pastoral call to be able to open new works with greater success and better results. The course consists of two years, one week face-to-face each year, and 11 monthly online follow-up classes.

SOPF - 2025

It will be open to all pastors who, perhaps for different reasons, have never received pastoral training, or if you are looking for an update or a time of pastoral renewal, we want to tell you that you will be welcome. Many pastors have already asked us for this, and we want to make it accessible (pastors and wives) to all those who seek to benefit from this program. It is an Apostolic boot camp, Monday through Friday, powerful and transforming. We will be considering what special price we can offer for pastors, stay tuned.

Pastors who attend will be given a diploma certifying their ministerial update.

CE - FOR INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS

Dr. Luis Montero coordinates together with the Supervisors of the Regions the continuity of the vision of the Apostolic Assembly of Building the Church, expanding Christian Education in countries of the International Mission Field, supporting where it is already established, collaborating where it is in stages of development and establishing where it does not yet have a Bible College. This year, we were able to support:

CUBA: We were able to establish the IABC in Cuba, and a director was appointed. In addition, we were able to financially assist 15 pastors and provide two laptops. At the same time, a Christian Education coordinator for the entire Caribbean was established.

VENEZUELA: In Venezuela, we were able to donate \$1,500.00 to assist in the purchase of a laptop, projector, and screen to be used in the launching of the Jesus and Small Groups Strategy.

MOZAMBIQUE: An offering was sent to support trainings that took place.

MEXICO: We are currently subsidizing the doctorate program with scholarships for 10 pastors in Mexico.

We support IABC by visiting Cuba, Chile, Peru, Mexico, India, Barcelona, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, etc. **EUROPE:** Re-established IABC in Europe (2023), where we held a Strategy of Jesus workshop.

We recognize the hard work done by Bishop Steven Moran, the Regional Supervisors, and those who assist them: Bishop Andy Lopez in India and Asia (2022-2024), Pastor Isaias Velez in Cuba (2022), Missionary Gabriel Pereira in Europe (2023-2024), Bishop Gildardo Suarez in Mexico, Bishop Ruben Kisiel in the South Cone, Bishop Sergio Comparato, Mozambique, Missionary Isaac Soberano, Caribbean, Bishop Fernando Perez in the Central region, and all those who lead Christian Education in their fields of work, thank you.

IABC IN THE MISSION FIELDS - 2025

• Equip with electronic devices (laptop, projectors, monitors, storage memories, etc.)

- so that classes can be taught and reach the students.
- Translate school materials into different languages.
- Take the School of Pastoral Formation to the International Mission Field (we already have edited material)
- At the moment, we are subsidizing 10 pastors from Mexico with the doctorate program.
- Extend the IABC online to all countries that request it.
- We have three academic assistance projects in process: Mozambique, the Caribbean, and Venezuela.

APOSTOLIC COMMITTEE OF EDUCATORS

Dr. Ruth Crutchfield heads the Apostolic Committee of Educators, which is currently working on the development of a core and permanent curriculum for local churches. This curriculum will begin at preschool age and go through the end of high school. This will help us prepare our children, juniors, and youth to live a life that is grounded in the Word of God, doctrinal principles, and relationship with Christ. The Apostolic Committee of Educators successfully held the Apostolic Educators Summit in April 2024 in Dallas, TX., where 25 educational professionals gathered to begin work on the above curriculum. Since then, several meetings have been held where these educators, who have at least a Bachelor's degree in Education, have continued to plan and expand the curriculum for the Local Apostolic Church. By December 2025, the goals of this committee are to recruit a minimum of 100 professionals to assist in the completion of the curriculum.

EDUCATOR SUMMIT - 2025

The Apostolic Educators Summit will take place in May 2025; information will be ready for the National Convention.

A-VBS COORDINATOR (APOSTOLIC VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL)

Professor Cynthia Guzman will be forming an editorial team whose main task will be, each year, to put together the complete A-VBS package (5-day package). The first package will be ready by April 2025 with God's help.

DISTRICT TRAINING SEMINARS

Dr. Joel Dominguez heads this coordination with different expert trainers depending on the training. In 2023, we were grateful to have held a 6-week District Training Seminar on "Teaching Techniques" through Zoom. We had over 300 connections and over 500 virtual attendees and received excellent reports on the impact these trainings had on all participants. These training sessions are aimed at strengthening the local leadership of the congregations, the link will be provided to the pastors and will help us to better prepare our church to have a safe and comfortable environment for all church attendees.

SEMINARS 2025

The goal for 2025 is to hold training seminars on the following topics:

- Boosting the Teacher's Gift in local church members.
- Training for writers.
- Specialized courses: Platform, altar, courtesy, follow-up, use of technology, etc.
- Create formal and uniform training on sexual harassment and child abuse prevention.

ACCREDITED APOSTOLIC THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

"The most powerful means of transformation: Education."

The Secretariat of Christian Education understands that the only way of transformation is through Christian Education, with this conviction, we seek to establish an integral Apostolic academic culture, understanding that the phenomena that are affecting secular Education are not the one that mainly affects us, rather it is the culture within our institution, and it is the one that requires transformation. Apostolic hymnology has been lost, the home altar is forgotten, and devotionals are no longer remembered. Bible memorization is lost in the past, before, you had your Bible with your name and dedication, now, all electronic devices have Bibles, but very few have their own Bible. This challenge cannot be overcome with the possession of a book but, instead, requires the establishment of a new academic structure, and how we seek to fulfill this vision is to bring about a transformation from the inside out, what does this mean? We are directing all the coordinations and committees (all those I have named above) with a common purpose: to bring about an appreciation and relevance of Apostolic Christian Education in our leaders and congregations.

This will pave the way for a fully accredited Apostolic Theological Seminary. This is more than a project; it is a generational responsibility that we have. It is to establish a recognized apostolic academic institution that will provide an identity of preparation and professionalism. This Apostolic Seminary will not be the beginning of the journey; it will be the academic structures that we build in the local churches: A Permanent Curriculum, Homeschooling, Private Apostolic Academies, Apostolic VBS, Teachers trained and recognized for their gift of teaching, education trainings, IABC in the Districts, etc. All these programs will transform us from within, and when they graduate from high school, there will be an Apostolic Accredited Seminary waiting for them.

This is an Apostolic Academic Culture. Education can no longer be just a requirement; it must be our culture. The Apostolic Theological Seminary will create a door through which our youth can find their identity and an Apostolic Cultural Connection. This Seminary will allow the issue of certifications, ministerial updates, accredited trainings, etc., this will allow the Apostolic Assembly to have an Association of Apostolic Professionals in different fields to minister to the church more effectively, especially in the turbulent times ahead. Dr. Arnulfo Cedillo is coordinating the bases needed to explore the accreditation process. He has already identified potential committee members, met with a potential accreditation consultant, and discussed points of interest regarding accreditation and the accreditation process. A clear understanding of accreditation requirements and WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) requirements has been identified. This is an opportunity, and we should take advantage of it.

2025 CE OPPORTUNITIES & PROJECTS

We are so excited to announce that in 2025, there is an opportunity to participate in an educational pilgrimage. On February 17-24, 2025, we will be taking a trip to Greece to walk the same roads as the Apostle Paul did during the establishment of the Apostolic Church. From the IABC in the districts to the development of educational programs that transform each local church, these initiatives reflect a commitment to equip every believer with the knowledge and tools to fulfill their God-given calling. Whether through the International Apostolic Bible College, new apostolic literature, or support for homeschooling families, Christian Education remains a cornerstone of the church's vision.

I greatly appreciate the support and guidance that our Bishop President Felipe Salazar has given me from the beginning, my fellow Board members always supporting me, the entire ministerial body, and the Lord's church. To my assistant, Min. Alex Tarin, all the staff at the general offices, and the directors inside and outside the country thank you, thank you very much.

The Department of Social Assistance's responsibility is to fulfill the corporation's moral duty to assist indigents, protect orphans, widows, and especially to assist those pastors that reach retirement age without financial resources. Thus, the Antonio Castaneda Nava Charitable Foundation and Trust Fund was established in 1993.

- The purpose of the Antonio Nava Charitable Foundation is to serve the members of the entire Apostolic Assembly in the continental United States and abroad. Members of the Apostolic Assembly are eligible to petition the Trust Fund for the following assistance:
- To provide financial assistance in the event of the death of a member,
- To provide funds for relief and support in the form of supplemental retirement and pension benefits for pastors,

Every pastor who has a current credential receives the death benefit insurance from the Apostolic Assembly. This is a group policy that has been established to take care of the funeral expenses that a pastoral family will incur upon the death of a family member. We know that this process is very difficult for families to navigate, and therefore, we have continued this commitment and have maintained the standard industry level coverage. This death benefit was used by 31 families from November 2022 to November 2024. The total payout for this 2-year period was \$488,000.00. We encourage all our pastors to ensure that they have a current credential each year.
